1430 – 1600 **Setting the benchmark: LIBOR and the upswing in international financial services and securities fraud investigations and prosecutions**

Drawing on their experiences in criminal and regulatory matters in Asia, Europe and the Americas, panellists will discuss the key issues and lessons to be learnt from recent international securities and financial services-related investigations and prosecutions.

The panel will cover new theories of liability (such as cases involving LIBOR in multiple jurisdictions and Standard & Poors in the US), on-going securities-related prosecutions (such as those of the Parmalat-related prosecutions of international bankers and company insiders in Italy), recent defence victories (such as the acquittals of Nortel's three most senior executives in Canada), and the increased number of insider trading prosecutions.

1120 – 1250 **Nowhere to hide: offshore tax havens and the loss of secrecy in multinational tax fraud investigations and prosecutions**

Since the Middle Ages bank secrecy shrouded international tax evasion. Bank secrecy was codified by some countries during the Second World War. Over the 50 years following 1945, worldwide bank secrecy proliferated.

In 2009 the US government was able to reverse the tide and unveil massive cross-border tax evasion schemes perpetrated by banks in Switzerland. Since then, Germany, Italy, France and Brazil have scored victories against bank secrecy and uncovered similar cross-border tax evasion schemes. The US government has expanded cross-border investigations to Israel and India. Recently the US government finalised implementation of the Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act. FATCA requires foreign financial institutions to report their US customers to the IRS. Several countries have agreed to require their banks to comply with FATCA in return for similar reporting from US financial institutions for their citizens. The panel will discuss these recent events and the way forward.

The IBA's **Human Rights Institute** (HRI) works across the Association, to promote, protect and enforce human rights under a just rule of law, and to preserve the independence of the judiciary and the legal profession worldwide.

Other institutions established by the IBA include the **Southern Africa Litigation Centre** and the **International Legal Assistance Consortium**.

Criminal Law Section overview

The Criminal Law Committee provides a forum for members from many countries and criminal justice systems to meet regularly, communicate, exchange views, and monitor developments in substantive and procedural criminal law. The committee focuses on developments of transnational and international significance. The interaction and cooperation within the committee keeps members informed of developments in criminal law and criminal procedures through newsletters and appointed rapporteurs. The Business Crime Committee's primary objective is to promote awareness within the business community and among transactional lawyers of the growing significance of legal compliance.

North American Regional Forum overview

The North American Regional Forum covers Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico, the United States, and English-speaking areas of the Caribbean. Launched at the Chicago Annual Conference in 2006, the NAF is the focus for all activities in the region, and organises sessions and a luncheon event at each IBA Annual Conference for education and networking. Future plans include organising conferences in partnership with other IBA committees and fora, as well as other bar associations and legal organisations in the region.
